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Tribute To A Man Who Lived Strong



Ted Strong D-16, 4/7/1936-10/14/2011

On October 14th 2011 Ted Strong, Founder, Owner, and President of Strong Enterprises passed away.

Ted envisioned a safer skydiving experience and had the ability, drive and passion to make that happen. Introduced to the sport when gear was military surplus and the terms free fall and relative work were barely whispers, Ted helped lead the sport to what it is today! While in the Army he was a member of the West Point Sport Parachute Club and coached and instructed the USMA Cadet Parachute Team leading them to first place victories.

Ted realized the need for specialized equipment and started Strong Enterprises in his parents' basement. Originally modifying surplus military equipment it took only a few short years for Ted to make the first sport system, and change the way of the sport. It was said at the time that there were two types of people in the sport; those that had the Strong Lo-Po reserve, and those that wished they had one.

Ted didn't stop there instead he simply went on to the next new idea. Tandem! His goal in inventing the tandem system was to provide a safer more controlled environment for the inexperienced to learn to fly. Through the growing pains of countless lessons learned, massive legal debates and fees, and years of FAA and political campaigns Ted never wavered in his desire to bring tandem to the same level of safety and freedom enjoyed by those solo skydivers. Finally in 2001 the rules were rewritten and Tandem was included as a recognized skydiving discipline. Today millions of people around the world are able to enjoy the thrill of skydiving because one visionary never gave up.

Teds passion was infectious, just talk to him for a few minutes and you would start to believe that you could move the stars, and knew that he could. Ted had a way of making everyone feel at ease, welcome, and part of the family. He had a way that let you know you were forever part of the Strong Team. He took pride in his Strong Tandem Team and was always willing to answer any questions, explain any gear, or provide any support necessary to ensure everyone had what they needed.

As our Team Leader has gone to his next great adventure it is now our responsibility as his trusted team to continue his teachings, passion, and commitment to safety during every jump we make. Strong Enterprises will continue to provide support to you our teammates, and look forward to another fifty years providing the excellent service that Ted spent the past fifty years giving to you!

New T.I.C.C. Cross Over Requirements

Cross-over Candidates will attend the classroom lecture and be required to complete certain TICC jumps according to their experience level.

- **Less than 100 Tandem jumps.**
 - All of Phase I and Phase II jumps.
- **100-499 Tandem jumps.**
 - Level I
 - Level III
 - Level IV
- **More than 500 Tandem jumps.**
 - Level I
 - Level IV

1. Strong Enterprises has a total of 14 Tandem Re-Certification Centers World Wide to better serve our customers. You can download the complete listing along with a map guide on our website, www.strongparachutes.com, click Information Central / Tandem Information and Forms.
 2. The "Examiner Safety Handles" were developed to insure easy access for the experienced skydiver (not the student), acting as passenger, to the cut away handle and the reserve ripcord in the event the Candidate fails to cut away or activate the reserve during an emergency
- The change came about from an observation made by an Examiner riding as Passenger during a drogue-in-tow malfunction.

"..I observed that being suspended horizontally under the drogue placed the reserve ripcord slightly down behind my shoulder, and that in order to pull it, I would have to face forward, taking my eyes off the ripcord, and reach back blindly."

AUSTRALIAN PARACHUTE FEDERATION CONVENTION 2011

Venue Location: *Pullman Reef Hotel and Casino.*

The well organized volunteer organization, had at least four highly visible people coordinating registrations, presentations, sessions and Awards Events. The APF is the organization which controls skydiving and parachuting at nearly all the civilian operations in Australia. With the approval of the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) it sets the standards of operation, conducts competitions, issues licenses and instructor ratings, conducts exams and publishes a magazine (ASM) and newsletter to keep its members informed of current events and safety standards.

The conference opened with a Welcome morning Tea, an opening address by APF CEO and a talk given by Andrew Plymton of the Australian Sports Commission. There were four speakers from the US, Norm Kent gave an inspiring very Zen presentation on "Skills Mastery", followed by USPA President Jay Stokes on "USPA and the Future," Tom Noonan gave several talks, "Sport Canopy Evolution", a joint talk on "19 Commandments of Tandem" with Jay Stokes and special comments from Ted regarding commandment #4 the importance of fitting the harness properly before climbing in the airplane. Ted also presented a well attended "Tandem Forum Workshop" on the last day of the conference.

NEW ZEALAND

Ted, Rory Hatchett, and Craig Morris paid a visit to Skydive Cairns, one of two local commercial tandem operations located a few blocks from the conference. A storefront is the base for signing up tandem jumpers and signing waivers. A bus drives them about twenty minutes to the DZ. Next door, stairs lead to a second floor parking garage. A 20' x 40' open air fenced area forms the carpeted "packing room". Three sewing machines, a table for cutting lines, gear packing and repairs are performed here as well as boxes of brochures and general storage for the storefront. Packer Selwyn Macintosh has been packing for 6 years and has 30K pack jobs to his credit. We had a great time at the Awards Ceremony Banquet on the pool deck entering through the "Wildlife Dome" atop the hotel. All the nocturnal Australian wildlife were roaming freely in the large atrium filled with plants and ponds.

Ted took the opportunity to sit with Jyro and hash out more details for Strong Enterprises to manufacture the Icarus canopy under license in Florida.



AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND

Arrived 9:00 p.m. Took a shuttle to the Best West hotel near airport. Hired a Taxi the next day to New Zealand Aerospots. Arrived 11:00 am 26 May. Mark Horning and Francios from the DZ Matamata were waiting for us. Tony Morris came and took us all to lunch. Tony said Peter Gardener planned to come in the afternoon. We dumped our luggage in the room and went to the drop zone, located about 5 miles outside of town, a beautiful valley in the middle of sheep ranches. NZONE is the first tandem skydive operator in New Zealand, and has skydived over 170,000 people over the past 20 years!

Strong T/E Sasa Jojic

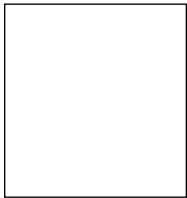
Tandem Operations Manager - Queenstown
